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Theological Bias

"And when they come from the market place, except they bathe (*baptizo*) themselves, they eat not and many other things there are, which they have received to hold, washings (*baptismos*) of cups, and pots, and brazen vessels" (Mark 7:4).

I sat in class and heard a theologian at a local seminary comment on this verse and define the Greek words for baptism – "cleansing." He then argued that the mode is not inherent in the word and could be "sprinkling" or "pouring" as well as "immersion."

This is absolute "theological bias." The professor preaches for a denomination that comes out of the Reformation Age and is devoted to "sprinkling" as acceptable baptism. He side-steps the fundamental meaning of *baptizo* and *baptismos* to rationalize his religious practice, and in so doing perverts what Mark writes. The word "baptism" means "to dip," "submerge," "plunge," or "immerse" and specifically reveals what the Pharisees were doing.

The Pharisees considered themselves ceremonially unclean when they returned from the public market and ritually submerged and bathed in water to purify themselves. They did the same thing to household utensils each time they ate. What they did to the pots and pans they did to themselves. It was no mere ceremonial "sprinkling" or "pouring" of water on their head, some part of the body, or on the vessels. It was immersion – the meaning and Biblical definition of *baptizo* (see Romans 6:4).

People often asked why the religious world is so hopelessly divided. And this is one reason: Bible students refuse to let the meaning of words define what a text says and what they believe and practice; instead they distort meaning of words by what they already believe. Theological bias prevents the gospel and causes division.
