- The stories of Micah (not the prophet), a Levite and his concubine, and Ruth fit into this period.




 In part because the foolishness of Solomon's son, Rehoboam, the kingdom divides into the kingdoms of Israel (north) and Judah (south).




DIVIDED KINGDOM

- In part because the foolishness of Solomon's son, Rehoboam, the kingdom divides into the kingdoms of Israel (north) and Judah (south).
- About 200 years after the kingdoms divide, Israel, because of its wickedness, is taken into captivity, while Judah continues for some time.
- Written prophets of the period include Isaiah, Jeremiah, Hosea, Joel, Amos, Obadiah, Jonah, Micah, Nahum, Habakkuk, and Zephaniah.

- Though it can be difficult to remember all the names of the kinds of Israel and Judah, it is possible and beneficial.
- The kings of the northern kingdom of Israel are Jeroboam, Nadab, Baasha, Elah, Zimri, Omri, Ahab, Ahaziah, Jehoram, Jehu, Jehoahaz, Joash, Jeroboam II, Zechariah, Shallum, Menahem, Pekahiah, Pekah, and Hoshea.
